



EVALUATE YOUR CREDENTIALS Name Class OBJECTIVE To evaluate credentials that you currently hold, and how they might relate to a job in aviation. PROCEDURE

1. Identify any credentials that you have earned thus far. Credentials might include courses you have completed, tests that you have passed (e.g. advanced placement exams, FAA remote pilot written exam, etc.), or certifications that you have earned (e.g. CPR certification, Google badges, Eagle Scout, student pilot certificate, etc.). Record your credentials in the space below.

2. Use the Credentials Checklist on the following page. Ideally, the credentials you evaluate should be related in some way to an aviation career you are considering. Make additional copies of the table as necessary.
