Subject: Alternative Method of Compliance (AMOC) for Airworthiness Directive 2018-02-05, Paragraph (g), "Inspect Fuel Selector Cover"

Dear Mr. Oord:

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) received your proposal dated February 7, 2018, proposing a global alternative method of compliance (AMOC) to paragraph (g) of Airworthiness Directive (AD) 2018-02-05.

The Atlanta Aircraft Certification Office approves your AMOC proposal, for a thirty (30) day relief from paragraph (g) of the AD making the initial compliance of paragraph (g) of the AD from February 7, 2018, to March 9, 2018. The FAA agrees that the additional time would allow operators additional time to prepare and comply with the requirement of the AD.

This AMOC is transferable with the aircraft to a new owner/operator.

Before using this AMOC, notify your appropriate principal inspector, or lacking a principal inspector, the manager of the local flight standards district office/certificate holding district office.

The preceding paragraph also applies to any applicable foreign-registered aircraft upon transfer of the aircraft to the U.S. registry if compliance with the AMOC has not been accomplished.

All provisions of AD 2018-02-05 that are not specifically referenced above remain fully applicable and must be complied with accordingly.
