Subject: Alternative Method of Compliance (AMOC) for Airworthiness Directive 2018-02-05, Paragraph (g), "Inspect Fuel Selector Cover"

Dear Mr. Oord:

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) received your request on April 4, 2018, proposing a global alternative method of compliance (AMOC) to paragraph (g) of Airworthiness Directive (AD) 2018-02-05. The AD's initial compliance date is March 9, 2018. The FAA issued an AMOC letter on March 7, 2018, which extended this compliance date to April 9, 2018. AD 2018-02-05 will be superseded by AD 2018-07-03.

The Atlanta Aircraft Certification Office approves your AMOC proposal for additional relief from paragraph (g) of AD 2018-02-05. Therefore, the initial compliance time of paragraph (g) of the AD is extended from March 7, 2018 to the effective date of AD 2018-07-03. The FAA agrees that the additional time would allow operators additional time to prepare and comply with the requirement of the AD.

This AMOC is transferable with the aircraft to a new owner/operator.

Before using this AMOC, notify your appropriate principal inspector, or lacking a principal inspector, the manager of the local flight standards district office/certificate holding district office.

The preceding paragraph also applies to any applicable foreign-registered aircraft upon transfer of the aircraft to the U.S. registry if compliance with the AMOC has not been accomplished.

All provisions of AD 2018-02-05 that are not specifically referenced above remain fully applicable and must be complied with accordingly.
