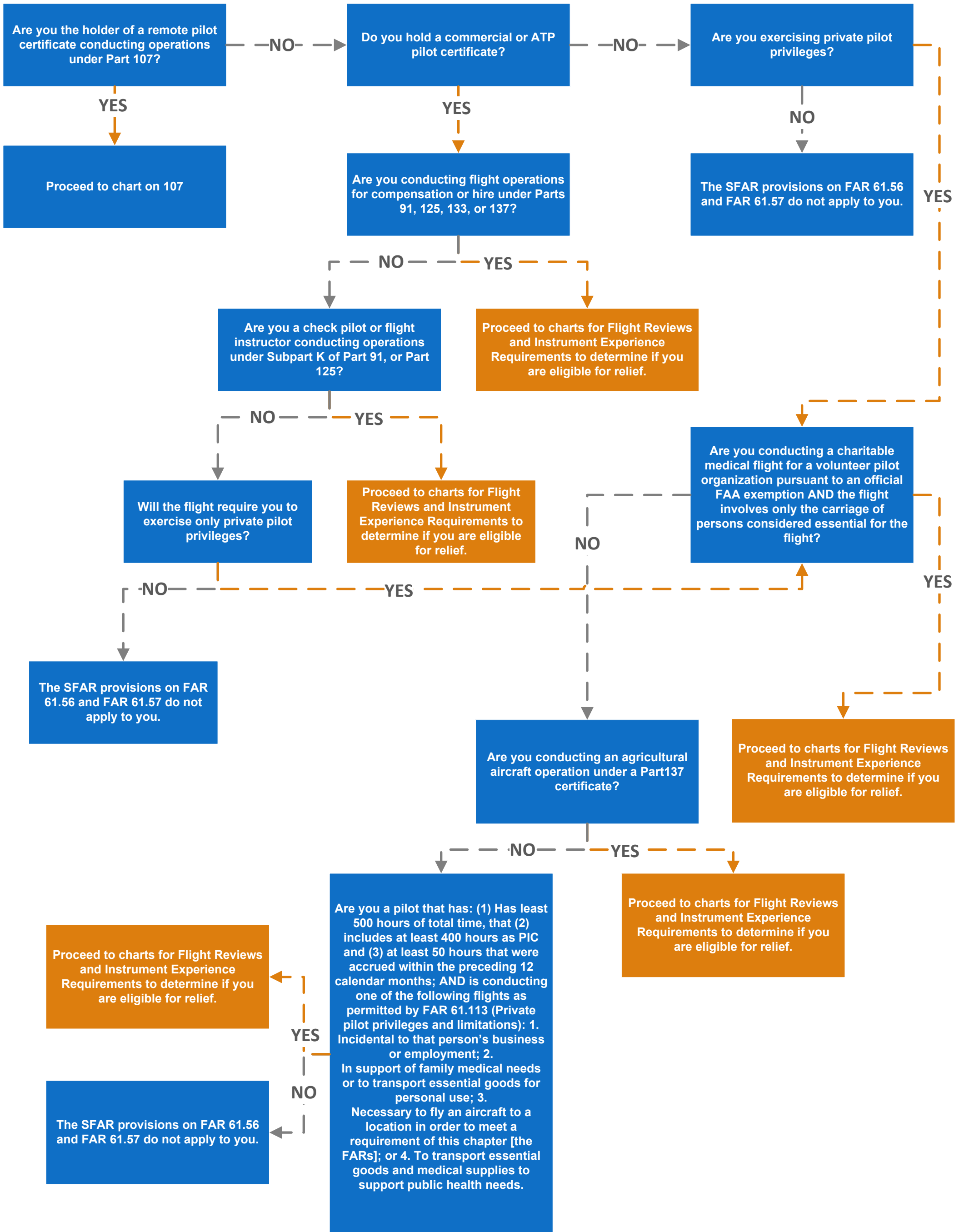


Do the SFAR's provisions concerning flight reviews (FAR 61.56) apply to me?



Are you the holder of a remote pilot certificate conducting operations under Part 107?

Incidental to that person's business or employment; 2. In support of family medical needs or to transport essential goods for personal use; 3. Necessary to fly an aircraft to a location in order to meet a requirement of this chapter [the FARs]; or 4. To transport essential goods and medical supplies to support public health needs.

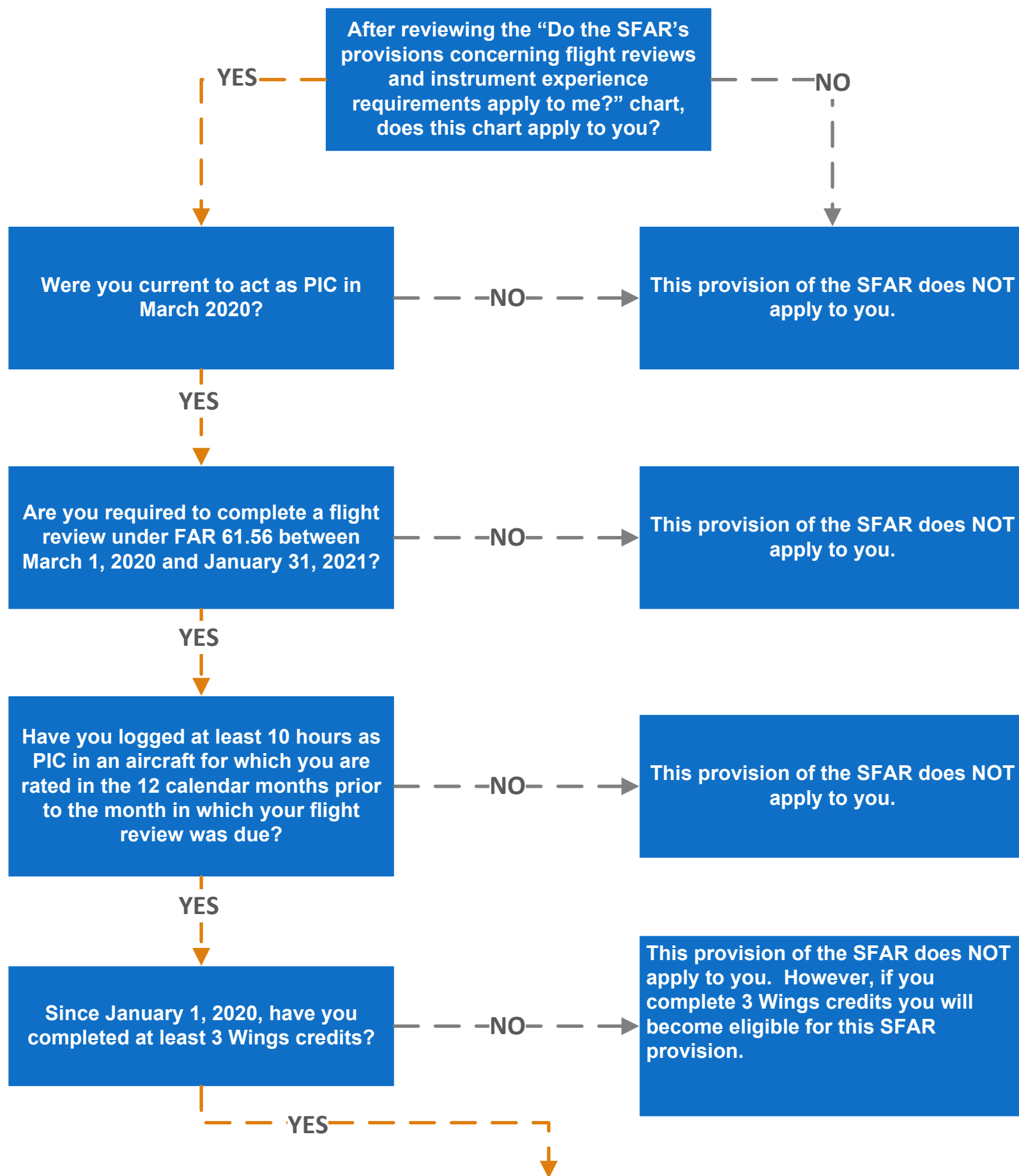

FAR 61.56 – Flight Review



This provision of SFAR 118-2 applies to you. Under SFAR 118-2, your flight review expires as follows:

If your flight review originally expired March through May 2020, your flight review is expired. SFAR 118-2 provides no additional relief.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of June 2020, then it now expires September 30, 2020.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of July 2020, then it now expires October 31, 2020.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of August 2020, then it now expires November 30, 2020.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of September 2020, then it now expires December 31, 2020.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of October 2020, then it now expires December 31, 2020.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of November 2020, then it now expires January 31, 2021.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of December 2020, then it now expires February 28, 2021.

If your flight review originally expired at the end of January 2021, then it now expires March 31, 2021.
