The FAA Air Traffic Organization intends to hold two meetings to inform airspace users and others about an Alaskan airspace analysis that is beginning. The FAA will also use this opportunity to solicit input concerning subject matter that has not been considered, but may be pertinent to the study. To maximize the opportunity for attendance, two meetings will be held. Interested persons may attend either meeting.

The focus of the airspace analysis will be to (1) develop strategies to streamline air traffic movement to relieve congestion and enhance safety for aircraft flying into and out of the Anchorage bowl airports, (2) to ensure that the FAA air traffic system can meet military exercise needs now and into the future, (3) to make recommendations concerning air traffic sector boundaries in enroute and terminal airspace that will promote safety and enhance traffic flows, (4) to examine the use of emerging technology and make recommendations for further development of Global Positioning System (GPS) and Area Navigation (RNAV) procedures, and (5) to promote working partnerships between major Alaska airport operators and Air Traffic Control to ensure that future airport development will contribute to further efficiencies in aircraft movement.
