



Report for Brian Blum at KMGJ

Below is a summary of scores and feedback from all the usable evaluations which were submitted for you during the 2026 Flight Training Experience Award application period. Many flight training providers receive exceptionally high scores so we also share with you the distribution of the overall aggregate scores for comparison.

1. Eligibility

To be eligible for an award, you needed to receive at least 5 unique evaluations, each at least 80% complete

A survey response was considered 'usable' if the respondent answered at least 80% of the questions required for scoring.

A CFI was considered 'eligible' for an award if they received at least 5 unique, usable responses.

Average scores were based on all usable responses received and have been rounded where necessary.

Your percentile rank was calculated by comparing your score to scores of all other (nominated/eligible) CFIs. Percentile ranks were calculated at both national and regional levels and may have been rounded.

Your performance (percentile rank) compared to all other eligible CFIs in your region was one of many factors that informed award decisions.

85.00	It is my pleasure to nominate Brian Blum, for the AOPA Flight Training Experience Award. Across roughly 80 hours of instrument training, Brian created a learning environment that was calm, patient, and intentionally low-stress, remarkable in the inherently demanding IFR atmosphere. What truly sets Brian apart is timing and judgment. He offered clear, concise guidance exactly when it was useful, and just as importantly, he held back when I was task-saturated shooting approaches, loading procedures, or handling reroutes. That restraint let me fly the airplane first, manage workload, and stay ahead of the aircraft without feeling overwhelmed. After the flight, his debriefs were focused and actionable, and I could apply them immediately on the next lesson. Brian models professionalism and safety, using standardized briefs, disciplined self-made checklists, and meticulous record-keeping (down to using timers to ensure training time is logged accurately). Under his instruction, I built durable IFR habits: structured briefing, thoughtful workload management, and smart use of automation. Those habits were central to earning my instrument rating. Many instructors can teach procedures; far fewer can teach sound judgment under workload. Brian does both, consistently and exceptionally. I recommend him without reservation for this award.

10.2 NPS Grouping

Promoters: Ideally, all of your customers would be promoters. Promoters would fly with you again in the future and would tell others how great they think you are.
