## 1. Eligibility

To be eligible for an award, you needed to receive at least 5 unique evaluations, each at least 80% complete

A survey response was considered 'usable' if the respondent answered at least 80% of the questions required for scoring.

A CFI was considered 'eligible' for an award if they received at least 5 unique, usable responses.

Average scores were based on all usable responses received and have been rounded where necessary.

Your percentile rank was calculated by comparing your score to scores of all other (nominated/eligible) CFIs. Percentile ranks were calculated at both national and regional levels and may have been rounded.

I needed someone to challenge me. I needed someone to hold me accountable. But most importantly, I needed someone to make me safe for my wife and kids. Tizi treated me like any of his other students and ultimately made me a much better and safer pilot.
89.00	Tiziano (Tizi) Bernard was my very first flight instructor; being someone completely new to this area of aviation, I was incredibly nervous to go on my first flight. However, Tizi made it the best and most comfortable experience possible. Tiziano is very thorough as a CFI. Prior to our lessons, he would make sure I understood the theoretical portion of the lesson such as showing me the power curve for lessons on slow flight, and the turning tendencies such as torque, spiraling slipstream, and p-factor. All of these theoretical lessons were explained in detail with drawings and chapters from textbooks. Being an Aerospace Engineering major, it was easier to pick up what he taught; however, the level of detail ensured that anyone he teaches would easily understand the theories behind all the lessons. Tiziano also has an incredibly detailed lesson plan split into multiple lessons, and within each lesson were stages specifying what would be covered on ground and the maneuvers in flight. Furthermore, he had various documents easily accessible to make sure I was prepared for my first flight. Tizi was very flexible in his lesson plan and made sure to progress at a pace where the student was proficiently able to learn each maneuver. He made sure to go over every maneuver multiple times and let the student determine the pace and when they were ready to move on to the next maneuver. Additionally, Tizi made sure to make the most of our flight time every lesson. There would not be a single minute wasted as it was spent on verbally explaining a maneuver, physically demonstrating a maneuver, and then allowing me to conduct said maneuver multiple times until I was comfortable moving on to the next one. Although I only had a handful of lessons with Tizi, I learned a lot more than that. In addition to what he covered according to his lesson plan, he also made sure that before I left, I would have the chance to see various maneuvers that other CFIs were more nervous to demonstrate. He went over engine failure maneuvers as well as rejected takeoff maneuvers in a very safe manner, so that I had a chance to experience these maneuvers with him. Furthermore, not only did he proficiently train me in flight training, but he also gave valuable advice on what to look for in my future flight training lessons and CFIs. Tizi not only has the qualities of an instructor that deserves this award, but he also has the qualities of a teacher that believes in his students and motivates them to do their best. He puts all his effort into making sure his students learn every lesson with extensive detail and provides them with all the necessary resources to succeed in the industry whether they want to fly commercially or as a hobby.

His depth of experience is clear from the start, yet what defines him is humility, warmth, and complete focus on his students. He met me exactly where I was. He built confidence, sound judgment, and disciplined safety habits without ego or pressure. When I began my aviation journey (five years ago), I had dreamed of flying for thirty years. I am fifty-four years old now, and when I finally reached a point where I could buy my own airplane and afford as much instruction as I needed, I thought I had everything lined up and figured out. What I did not have was confidence. I trained for more than two years as a student pilot and logged over two hundred hours before I ever took my checkride. We do it with confidence, with joy, and with the quiet assurance that came from Tizi's instruction. His combination of deep technical knowledge, genuine care, and real-world experience made that possible because he is a fantastic listener with the heart of a teacher. I feel like I am his only student. His attention, patience, and thoughtfulness are unmatched. Many instructors view teaching as a step toward something else. Tizi chooses to teach. That choice elevates every pilot he touches and lifts the safety culture around him. He changed how I think, not just how I fly. That is the mark of a master.
